The 1964 Eastern Canadian Championships, (now known as the Provincial Open Championships) was held in North Bay. The York Simcoe Men's Team was the first team from our zone to advance to the National Championships, beating a strong Hamilton team by a score of 12,331 to 12,235. At National Championships, Brunswick of Canada installed four lanes with automatic pinsetters in the Regina Armouries in Saskatchewan, to accommodate the spectators. The installation required 400 man-hours and was completed in just five days.

The tournament was a tremendous success as the Ontario from Toronto won the Ladies team and Billy Hoult from Scarborough, won the Men's single titles. Sadly, our Men's team was defeated by Winnipeg, by a score of 11,824 to 11,594.
